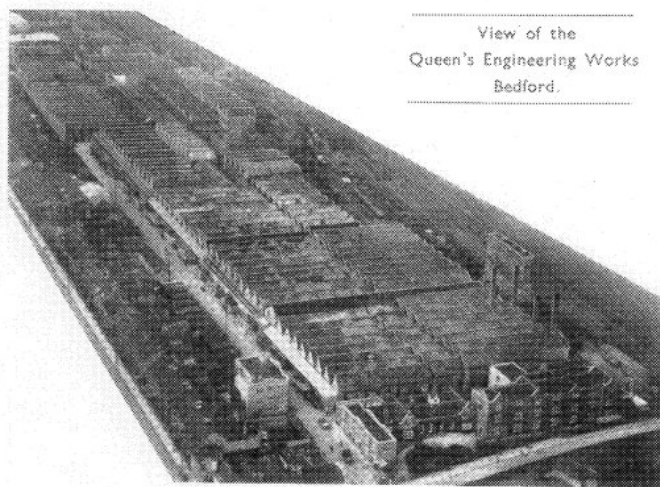

A CONSIDERABLE amount of interesting information has been issued from time to time through Government and other channels concerning the country's great industrial achievements and effort in providing the fighting forces with the vast quantities of armaments, equipment and supplies which the second world war demanded.

This Company, in common with numerous others throughout the country, made its maximum contribution to the total result, and although it is not our usual practice to make a special feature of production accomplishments, which in any case could not be revealed until some time after the end of hostilities as most of our work was secret and confidential, it is felt that there is justification for reporting briefly on the part we played, especially on behalf of H.M. Navy and the Merchant Navy. Thanks are due, and are sincerely given, to all members of our organisation for the loyal services they rendered and for the hard and continuous work carried out during the long period of the war, often under the most trying and difficult conditions.
